If you are the sort of person who pays attention to the ‘craft’ grapevine then 2020 is going to be a big year for cider. We’ve always enjoyed a quality drop and to celebrate cider being pushed to the fore we have compiled a list of some of our favourites.

Hunt’s Sussex Cider

We love Hunt’s and this was the first cider we ever sold. Made with love and care by the family in Seddlescombe, East Sussex with zero chemical input.

Hairy Pig 4.8% 500ml. The lightest in the range, tangy and refreshing with a clean, smooth and delicate finish £4.40.

Hornet Dry 4.8% 500ml. A delicate dry cider with a floral bouquet and fresh fruity apple notes. £4.40

Crowman 6.0% 500ml. A vibrant amber colour, complex and substantial. Bit ballsy £4.80

Sussex Cider 6.8% 500ml. The first cider the family produced with its original retro label. Rich and full bodied. Absolutely delicious. £5.00

Hallets Real Cider

5.0% 33cl cans. An award winner from Blaengawney Farm in Caerphilly. A delicious, slightly sparkling medium blend made from oak aged Dabinett cider which has then been blended with the current year’s new cider. £4.00

Dunkertons Organic

Medium Organic Cider 5.0% 500ml bottles. This newest edition to their range is refreshingly easy drinking but with the classic Dunkertons deep apple flavour. £4.80

Medium Sweet Organic Perry, 7.5% 500ml bottles. Initially sweet with a dry finish, delicate and beautifully balanced. Ridiculously easy to drink and a good one to share. £5.00

Pilton Cider

Pomme Pomme 4.8% 37.5cl (half) bottles. Somerset keeved cider with quince. A fruity cider bringing together bittersweet cider apples and the unique tart astringency of the quince. A rare treat. £10

Ross Cider

2017 Raison D’Etre Cider 7.4% 75cl bottles. Made in Ross-on-Wye Herefordshire, ‘Reason for being’ made from their own grown Dabinett and Michelin apples, wild fermented in oak casks, patiently matured and bottle conditioned. £12
